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Quiz Syllabus & Rules

On the Occasion of Wildlife Week – 2022, National Zoological Park is organizing various outreach activities to spread the awareness among people about their environment. In this context, a Quiz on Wildlife will also take place at National zoological Park.

Eligibility: Class 6th to 8th students can participate in quiz competition

Date & Time: 5th October, 2022, 10:30AM to 12:30PM

Rules: The competition will be divided into three rounds, Preliminary Round, Buzzer Round, & Time breaking round.

Syllabus:

1. Keystone species, umbrella species, flagship species, indicator species, Indigenous and introduced / exotic species.

2. Economic importance, threats and conservation of non-chordates.

3. Mammalian characteristics and origin of mammals.

4. Morphological and physiological adaptations in mammals.

5. Wild Cats of India.

6. Thermoregulation, its role, aestivation, Hibernation (Mammals & Reptiles).

7. Morphological adaptations in bills and claws of Birds and Development of feathers.

8. Wildlife Protection Act, Project Tiger, Project Elephant, Project Snow Leopard.
